We work with schools, community groups, Friends of Sandall Beat and our Junior Rangers, and offer a wealth of Countryside Activities for all. From Walks and Woodland Workshops, to Orienteering and fun and games, there really is something for everyone!

Doncaster's Community Environment Centre is in the middle of Sandall Beat Wood Local Nature Reserve, a large urban woodland at the heart of Doncaster, between the Racecourse, Cantley Park and the former Markham Main colliery site.

The Centre is open to visitors between 9.30am and 3.30pm on weekdays, when the team will be happy to welcome you. A large classroom is also available for bookings by community groups for meetings or activities.
