Health Care and you

As you may know we sit on a variety of boards and meetings all focused on SEND in Doncaster. At the last **Making a Difference Meeting** Karl Bower, Designated Clinical Officer for SEND was in attendance explaining his role to parents. These conversations with parents were taken to the **Doncaster SEND Board** meeting where it was discussed that some parents had identified gaps in provision but also didn't have good experiences with clinical/health appointments. Karl and the SEND Board are keen to hear more on the difficulties that parents face when trying to access medical/health services for their children/young people with SEND.

In order to do this we need your stories and your feedback. We need to know what isn't working for children/young people with SEND in Doncaster with regards to accessing health services? What are the barriers you face? Have you been refused, denied or been told that a service your child requires isn't available in Doncaster? What clinical services have been unable to deal with your child's needs?

These services could range from GP appointments, hospital appointments such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language etc and also mental health appointments with CAMHS.

Home Educators Group

We are looking at bringing together parents of children/young people with SEND who are currently being home educated.

Estimated figures from the Department for Education states that in census data in autumn 2023/24, there were an estimated 92,000 children who were in elective home education.



By law parents/carers must make ensure their children receive a suitable full-time education if they are of compulsory school age. For some SEND families this means that their children/young people are educated at home. Some children/young people are educated at home because they cannot attend school for a number of reasons, such as ill health, they don't feel safe in school, or because their special educational needs cannot, or are not being met by their school or college. As a result of this some families feel they have no choice but to home educate their children/young people.

Home Education is also known as **Elective Home Education** is often seen as a last resort for many parents. At <u>Doncaster Parents Voice</u> we recognise that home educator parents of children/young people with SEND are often overlooked and forgotten about, and that's why we are creating a **Home Educator Group** in order for parents/carers to come together share best practices, what isn't working and where children/young people with SEND are being let down. We need your voice to raise awareness of the issues that home educator parents face so we can take these concerns to leads in SEND education in Doncaster and look at solutions to improve SEND support for families. What is ASCETS?

You have probably heard of the acronym ASCETS in school meetings, from other parents or even us and wondered who they are, and what they do. **ASCETS (Autism and Social Communication Education Training Service)** work with schools, children and young people and their families to support the improvement of learning outcomes, particularly where they have an autism diagnosis or social communication needs.

ASCETS work primarily with children from the age of 5 years old when they start attending F2 / Reception, up to the age of 25 when young people could still be accessing college. This work is focused on the ways in which they can contribute to the assessment, planning, delivery and review of pupils' achievements and progress, particularly through SEN support plans or other targeted plans run by schools with pupils and families.

Children who are younger than this are supported by the **Early Years Inclusion Team** (EYIT). The EYIT works with private, voluntary and independent early years settings and maintained nurseries to support children with SEND. This is inclusive of children who may have a diagnosis of autism or social communication needs.

ASCETS supports schools in developing robust provision for pupils with autism and social communication difficulties through the delivery of external training (ASCETS Autism Essentials) and bespoke training in school. The service consists of specialist teachers and specialist support officers whose work is mainly focused through the ways they can contribute to the support plans run by schools.

The ASCETS team are usually asked to assist with your child's educational needs at the request of a SENCO. **The ASCETS team cannot be contacted directly by parents/carers** and are designed to assist schools in providing the right support to your child/young person in a school setting.

The ASCETS Team also co-deliver workshops on a wide variety of topics connected to autism for parents/carers and young people. These are run in partnership with **Doncaster Autism Service, Doncaster Parents Voice, Doncaster Council** and **NHS South Yorkshire Integrated Care Board.** The workshops are regularly advertised on the <u>Doncaster Autism Service</u> and <u>Doncaster Parents Voice</u> Facebook page and the Doncaster Parents Voice website.

Carers Leave Act – New rights as a carer

New changes for the **The Carer's Leave Act** which came into effect on the 6 April 2024 has opened up many more possibilities for carers who are employed.

The new changes are:

- The Carer's Leave Act covers employees in England, Wales and Scotland.
- Employees are entitled to one week's unpaid leave per year if providing or arranging care for someone with a long-term care need.
- This leave can be taken flexibly (in half or full days) for planned and foreseen caring commitments.
- It is available from the first day of employment.
- It provides the same employment protections to employees as other forms of family-related leave, including protection from dismissal.
