
Three main funding streams that were sourced to fund the Summer Staycation Program.

Universal Summer Activity Fund



Introduction:

A funding budget of £250k of was agreed by the Mayor and Cabinet Members to provide a Universal Summer Activity Programme offer for all children and young people to access across Doncaster. The funding criteria was to provide a diverse range of face to face free activities, events or summer holiday clubs for all children and young people to participate in.

This funding also enabled Doncaster Council to support the Voluntary Community and Faith Sector Groups by supporting them with the opportunity to access monies in order to expand the delivery of provision across Doncaster. Doncaster Council has a commitment to supporting the Voluntary, Community and Faith Sector who are intrinsic to delivering essential support, intervention, and activities in communities.






There were three funding grants available, Micro, Medium and Large. Organisations were able to apply up to the total grant amount.

- 16 organisations applied for Micro Grant
- 3 organisations applied for Medium Grant
- 5 organisations applied for Large Grant



Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF)



Central Government announced a further investment of over £200 million per year over the next three years for the Holiday Activities and Food Programme. The programme is overseen by the Department for Education and is made available to the 152 upper tier local authorities to coordinate and provide free holiday provision including healthy food and enriching activities. Doncaster Council secured an annual budget of £1.3 million per year, to deliver holiday provision is for school aged children and young people from reception to year 11 (inclusive) who receive benefit-free related school meals. The programme is also open to children and young people with a special educational need and/or disability (SEND), and to wider vulnerable groups.

The aims of the programme are for children and young people to:


- Be active during the school holidays.
- Eat healthily over the school holidays.
- Be safe and not to be socially isolated.
- Have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition.
- Be more engaged with school and other local services.
- Take part in engaging and enriching activities which support the development of resilience, character and wellbeing along with their wider educational attainment.

Ensure that the families who participate in this programme:

- Develop their understanding of nutrition and food budgeting
- Are signposted towards other information and support, for example, health, employment, and education

Doncaster's HAF program is based on a local incubator model, whereby larger providers, as part of their grant agreement must work with smaller Voluntary, Community and Faith Sector organisations. This model has worked well over the last 2 years and has supported the growth and sustainability of smaller groups particularly post covid.



Short Breaks Funding

A total of £11,600 Short Break funds was made available to deliver a Summer Activity Program available to families to provide a break from caring for a disabled child and for the child to have a break from their carers.

The purpose of the Short Breaks Summer Program scheme (SB) is to help children and young people that have a disability and/or complex health need and to support families. The Council aim to offer opportunities to widen life experiences and enjoy recreational and learning activities; enhancing personal and social development.

Short Breaks Summer Program also provides a valuable break to families and primary carers. Short Break activity sessions can last from a few hours to a few days – during the day or evening.
