

Election of a Mayor for Doncaster **2025**



About this booklet

This booklet must be sent to you by law. That means everyone who is registered to vote will receive a copy individually. This may mean some households receive several copies.

It includes:

- · Information about the election
- · Voting information including postal and proxy votes
- Photo ID
- · Key dates up to and including the election
- How the Mayoral election result is calculated
- An election address (i.e. a statement) from each of the Mayoral candidates who has paid for inclusion

On Thursday 1 May 2025 electors in Doncaster will vote for a Mayor who will have a four-year term of office until 2029. On the same day you will also vote for local ward councillors and some areas will also vote for town and parish councillors. These votes are not connected to the Mayoral election.

The voting system

You can only vote for one candidate.

Vote in the Mayoral election using your white ballot paper, you must vote for only one candidate. Following a recent change in election law, the voting system for the Mayoral election will be the first past the post system, the candidate with the most votes will win.

The counting of votes will take place overnight on Thursday 1 May 2025. You will be able to find out the result at: **www.doncaster.gov.uk/elections**

The candidates

There are **12** candidates standing for the Mayor of Doncaster.

Of those 12 Candidates standing for Election, 9 have submitted an election address for inclusion in this booklet.

All candidates are listed in alphabetical order below and with any political party they are standing for or as an independent candidate or left blank. This is the order they will appear on the ballot paper.

Each election address included in this booklet has been supplied by the candidate, and the views expressed in their address are theirs alone and cannot be attributed to the Returning Officer or City of Doncaster Council.

The order in which the addresses of candidates appear in this booklet has been determined by the drawing of lots by the Returning Officer.

At your polling station

Before 1 May 2025 you should have received a poll card which includes the address of your polling station. You can only vote at the polling station stated on your poll card. You do not need to take the poll card with you to vote.

You DO need to take a valid form of photo ID with you to the polling station – you will not be able to vote without this.

Assistance with voting

The voting process should be accessible to all voters. We offer a range of support for disabled voters to enable them to vote independently or with assistance. To help do this, our polling stations have:

- Ramps or additional entrance for easier access.
- Adapted level polling booth for wheelchair users.
- Large print versions of ballot papers to view.
- Pencil grips and larger pencils to help you mark the ballot paper.
- Magnifiers to use when reading guidance or marking the ballot paper.
- Tactile Voting Devices, to enable blind and partially sighted people to mark their ballot papers independently.

Voters with disabilities can use any text to-speech apps, torch or magnifier that they have on their phone, to assist them in reading their ballot paper. The ballot box slot will be highlighted to help people with visual impairments to see where to place their marked ballot papers.

If you need any other extra support in order to help you vote, please call the Elections Team to see if they can help you on 01302 736874.

Voting by post

If you have applied for a postal vote, your postal ballot pack will be sent to you around 15 April 2025. If you applied after 1 April 2025, your pack will be sent to you around 19 April 2025. The Mayoral ballot papers (white) are in a combined pack with Council local ward ballot papers (yellow). Please return these back together along with your statement.

Town and Parish Council ballot papers (green) will be sent to those electors in the areas with contested elections, in a separate pack.

You must return your postal vote so that it reaches the Returning Officer by 10pm on Thursday 1 May 2025. To make sure your postal vote is counted it is recommended you post it in a Royal Mail post box as soon as possible. New rules mean your postal vote will be rejected if it is not returned correctly.

If you miss the post, you can only hand-deliver your postal vote to the Returning Officer at Civic Office, Waterdale, Doncaster DN1 3BU, or at a polling station before 10pm on Thursday 1 May 2025.

Anyone hand-delivering postal votes will be required to complete a form. The staff in the polling station or Civic Office reception will help with this. You may hand-deliver your own and no more than five other postal votes per election. If you are a campaigner, you can only hand in your own postal vote, and those of close relatives or people for whom you provide regular care.

Apply to vote by post or proxy

Anyone who is registered to vote can apply to vote by post, or appoint someone they trust to vote on their behalf as a proxy.

New applications for a postal vote must have been received by **5pm on Monday 14 April 2025**. You can apply for a postal vote online at: <u>www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote</u> or you can request an application form by calling 01302 736874 or email: electoralservices@doncaster.gov.uk

If by the time you receive this booklet the postal vote deadline has passed, there is still time to appoint someone you trust to vote on your behalf as a proxy. The deadline to make an application for a proxy vote is **5pm on Wednesday 23 April 2025**. You can apply online at: <u>www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote</u> or you can request a proxy voting form by calling 01302 736874 or email electoralservices@doncaster.gov.uk

In certain circumstances, emergency proxy voting may be available after the ordinary proxy deadline of Wednesday 23 April 2025. The deadline to make an emergency proxy application is 5pm on 1 May 2025.

Photo ID

You will need to show photo ID to vote at a polling station

You will only need to show one form of ID. It must be the original version and not a photocopy or photos on your phone. You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date, as long as it looks like you. The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote.

- A passport or passport card issued by an EEA state or a country whose citizens are Commonwealth citizens
- A driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state
- A biometric immigration document
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 100 (HM Armed Forces Veterans Card)
- A Blue Badge
- A national identity card issued by an EEA state
- An Older Person's Bus Pass
- A Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- An Oyster 60+ Card
- A Freedom Pass
- A National Entitlement Card issued by a local authority in Scotland
- A 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A War Disablement SmartPass or War Disabled SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- An Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland
- A Voter Authority Certificate or a temporary Voter Authority Certificate

Apply for a free photo ID

If you do not possess any of the forms of photo ID on the list, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate through the Government website: www.gov.uk/voting-photo-id



The deadline to apply for free voter ID for the elections on Thursday 1 May is **5pm on Wednesday 23 April 2025**.

At the polling station

On Thursday 1 May 2025, polling stations will be open between 7am and 10pm for you to cast your vote.

When you arrive at the polling station you will be asked for your name and address, as well as a valid form of photo ID. Staff will check you are on the electoral register and give you the ballot papers for the elections taking place in your area at which you are entitled to vote. For instructions on how to vote in each election, read the instructions on the top of the ballot papers.

If you have been appointed as a proxy to vote on behalf of someone else, you must show your own Photo ID.

Privacy screens will be available for anyone that requires them. If you would like your photo ID checked in private, just ask the polling station staff.




