Thank you for your Freedom of Information request dated 19 August 2025 for information about home maintenance and improvements traders. Please find below City of Doncaster Council's responses to the questions you have raised.

Response

Notice under Section 17(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 - REFUSAL TO DISCLOSE INFORMATION

Decision:

After carefully considering your request for information the Council has decided that to respond to your request would exceed the appropriate limit as defined in the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Basis for decision:

Section 12(1) of the Freedom of Information Act allows for a request for information to be refused where the cost of supplying this information exceeds the appropriate limit. After carefully considering your request for information the Council has decided that to respond to your request would exceed the appropriate limit as defined in the Freedom of Information (Appropriate Limit and Fees) Regulations 2004. The regulations allow a request for information to be refused where the cost of supplying this information exceeds £450 (or 18 hours of officer time).

Why does the exemption apply in this case?

The cost limit applies in this case because the City of Doncaster Council does not hold a central record of this information, as we do not have a complaint code that covers home maintenance and improvement. Therefore in order to determine this information a total of 3137 cases will need to be reviewed. It is estimated that each case will require a 3 minute investigation resulting in a total time of approximately 156 hours which would exceed the time limit.

In order for us to reconsider your request we ask that you make your request more specific by narrowing down the scope of your request. For example, removing questions 1 and 2.
