<b>PSPO NUMBER 2</b>	<p>The aim is to deter groups of people from behaving in an anti-social manner which has a detrimental effect on people in the community and in some cases causes damage to property and homes.</p> <p>Enforcement action will primarily focus on helping people to change behaviour, educate around community responsibility and use alternative sites for games.</p>	No person shall engage in games on the public highway in a way that causes a nuisance or annoyance to those living nearby in the area. (In any public place in the area outlined in red marked on Map 1)	At all times unless authorised to do so. (In any public place in the area outlined in blue marked on Map 3)</p>	At all times	No change proposed	<p>Whilst it is acknowledged that there has been a reduction in the number of reported complaints about this prohibition and no fixed penalty notices have been issued, the Council believes that if the prohibition is removed it is likely that this behaviour is likely to detrimentally affect the quality of life of those people in the PSPO area. Therefore, it is proposed to keep this prohibition.</p>

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

	<p><b><u>Additional notes and definitions for the purpose of the Order</u></b></p> <p><b>i) Licensed premises</b> – Will include those involved in continental markets / beer festivals will have obtained Temporary Event Notices, so will in effect be licensed premises for the time they are there.</p> <p><b>ii) Intoxicating substances</b> –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Substances with the capacity to stimulate or depress the central nervous system</li> <li>• Exemptions shall apply in cases where the substances are used for a valid and demonstrable medicinal use, given to an animal as a medicinal remedy, are cigarettes (tobacco) or vaporisers or are food stuffs regulated by food health and safety legislation</li> </ul>
