East side


- (i) From a point 19 metres north east of its junction with the northern kerb line of Lyndale Avenue for a distance of 40 metres in a south westerly direction

Notice is hereby given that the City of Doncaster Council proposes to make an Order under the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.

The effect of the Order will be to introduce a No waiting at any time restriction on the following lengths of road:-

Lyndale Avenue, Edenthorpe

Both sides

(i) From its junction with the eastern kerb line of Thorne Road for a distance of 15 metres in a south easterly direction

Thorne Road, Edenthorpe

East side

(i) From a point 19 metres north east of its junction with the northern kerb line of Lyndale Avenue for a distance of 40 metres in a south westerly direction

Exceptions to the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods and in connection with building industrial or demolition operations, the removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the services therein in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, for the collection and delivery of postal packets or if it is a vehicle being operated by or on behalf of the South Yorkshire Safety Camera Partnerships while carrying out roadside monitoring or enforcement operations. The usual exceptions for disabled persons vehicles will also apply.

PROPOSED PROHIBITION OF WAITING LYNDALE AVENUE, THORNE ROAD - EDENTHORPE

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The proposed traffic regulation order is necessary to prohibit vehicle parking at these locations which may impede the free flow of traffic and obstruct access for vehicles and pedestrians. The intention of the proposed traffic regulation order is to remove danger to pedestrians or other traffic using the roads concerned or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising.
